As a parent/carer I will:

- Contact the school by telephone on the first day of my child's absence and keep school informed regularly of any prolonged absence.
- Provide my child with the correct uniform, indoor shoes, a PE kit and a water bottle.
- Let the school know of any concerns or worries that may be affecting my child's learning, behaviour or ability to do home learning, so this can then be resolved quickly.
- Encourage my child to develop a positive attitude towards our every member of our community and beyond.
- Attend meetings with my child's teacher and other staff, aiming to be positive and productive, working towards moving my child on in their learning.
- Support and work with the school to ensure that the behaviour policies of the school are maintained.
- Keep-up-to-date with important details of relevant policies, meetings, events and information about my child.
- Encourage my child in their learning and offer appropriate support at home.

As a pupil I will:

- Come to school regularly and on time
- Wear school uniform
- Follow our school rules
- Accept responsibility for the things that I do
- Be responsible for my school and home learning.
- Take good care of the building, equipment and school grounds.
- Reflect on my behaviour and learning and learn from all experiences.
